

It's not just the frames that come in different styles – your window's glass can as well. The best glass for your windows depends on the style you want and the function you need it to accomplish. Explore these options:












### **ENERGY-EFFICIENT GLASS**

If you're looking to keep the heat inside in the winter and out in the summer, you should consider energy-efficient glass. Whether gas-filled, insulated or coated with sun-reflecting glazes, these glass options can cut that energy bill.



### **DECORATIVE GLASS**

Reed or frosted glass may not have the same functional benefits as other glass styles, but they'll improve your curb appeal and interior design.










### SOUND-DAMPENING GLASS

Don't worry about noisy neighbors or bustling traffic with this glass. It helps reduce the decibels outside to mere whispers indoors.



### **OBSCURE GLASS**

Obscure glass can keep your home more private. This glazed glass prevents people from seeing into your home. It's a great option for bathrooms or bedrooms.









#### **TEMPERED GLASS**

Tempered glass is three to four times stronger than an average pane of glass. Made through a special process, tempered glass doesn't break under normal pressure and never shards if it does break. This is ideal for windows that are close to the floor or located in high-traffic areas.



### **SECURITY GLASS**

Protect your home from intruders with security glass. These glass options, such as laminated panes, make it difficult to break into your home, while other options alert your home security system when broken.









## Important Questions to Ask Your Designer

To get the perfect replacement windows for your home, you need to have a long conversation with your window design expert. The more he or she knows about what you're looking for, the better the window options you'll get. Here are a few questions you can ask your designer to help narrow in on exactly what you want:

## WHICH FRAME MATERIAL DO YOU RECOMMEND FOR MY HOME?

You may have your heart set on wood frames, but your designer may prefer the much stronger and insulated fiberglass. Make sure you're on the same page, whether it's aluminum, vinyl, wood or fiberglass. There are many options that can give you the look of wood, with the benefits of a more durable material.









# WHAT INSULATION, WEATHER STRIPPING AND U-VALUE DO I NEED?

When you're dealing with cold temperatures for half the year, it's critical that your windows protect you from the weather outside. Let your design expert tell you about your various insulation options and learn about u-values as a quick way to compare different glass and windows. When it comes to energy-efficiency, it is best to stick to using objective energy measurements, like those from Energy Star. Windows must be a U=.3 or lower to qualify as Energy Star windows. The lower the U-value, the better the rating of the window.
